Art Competition

Please use plain white A4 paper (portrait or landscape). No computer graphics, please. The deadline for entering your artwork is Monday 21st May. Please hand your entry to your teacher. The winners will be selected by the Vicar's Picnic team and David Bray, local illustrator and artist, who created the Father Bez character which is used on the Vicar's Picnic posters. Schools will be informed of winners during the week beginning Monday 4th June.
